3.2.2.1 Workshops/seminars conducted on Research Methodology, Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) and entrepreneurship year wise during the year

1. Training for the faculty on online research supervision:

One day workshop was conducted on 2 July 2020 for the research supervisors of the Institute and six research guides for the academic year 2020-21 attended the session. The academic research coordinator was the chief resource person. Training was given on online monitoring and supervision of the students' research assignment. Demonstration and training were given on creation of google classroom for the research groups, creation of online assignments, assessment of online research assignment, and conducting online conferences on weekly basis for close supervision of the students' research. During the workshop, a common research design was formulated, guideline for preparation of common interview schedule was developed and research guideline for the students was finalised in accordance with the university norms.

2. State Level webinar on Covid-19 Psycho Social Issues and Challenges

On the occasion of World Mental Health Day, the Institute organized one day State Level webinar on Covid-19 Psycho Social Issues and Challenges on Saturday 10th October 2020. Altogether 120 participants from different districts of Maharashtra participated through online mode in the Webinar.

3. Webinar on Primary Prevention of Sexual Violence (PPPSV)

The Institute in collaboration with KEM Hospital Pune organized one day webinar on Primary Prevention of Sexual Violence (PPPSV) on 30th October 2020 and altogether 98 students attended the webinar.

4. Webinar on Cancer Prevention and Healthy Life Style

The special seminar was organized on Cancer Awareness and Prevention for the volunteers. The resource persons for the seminar were Ms. Florina Singh and Mr. Raghav Bij from Sanjeevani Life Behind Cancer, New Delhi. The volunteers were guided about the early signs of the cancer, approaching and availing treatment and also creating prevention about the same. The resource persons were welcomed and introduced by Mr. Pradeep Jare (Assistant Professor). Honorable Director Dr. Suresh Pathare of the institute also addressed the volunteers in this seminar by

stressing on the contribution of the organization Sanjeevani Life Behind Cancer, New Delhi in creating awareness and conducting various activities and seminars for the young ones. The seminar concluded with the vote of thanks delivered by Mrs. Aasawari Zapake (Assistant Professor). Around 115 volunteers participated in the seminar along with all the faculty members.

5. Workshop on Prohibition and Eradication of Human Sacrifice and Other Inhuman, Unwholesome and Aghori Practices and Sorcery Act (Superstition Prevention Act), 2013

Two-day training on Prohibition and Eradication of Human Sacrifice and Other Inhuman, Unwholesome and Aghori Practices and Sorcery Act 2013 (Superstition Prevention Act, 2013) was organized in collaboration with Social Welfare, Ahmednagar during 09th and 10th February 2021. 98 students participated in the workshop. It was a training of trainers (Mahithi Doot) for MSW students supported by Dt. Social Welfare Dept. in continuation with Samatha Rath and Samata Doot during 2011-14 and SC/ST Atrocities Prevention Act, 1989 awareness and training programmes in each block during 2015-2019

6. State Level Seminar on “Social Work Response to Covid-19”

Two Days State Level Seminar on “Social Work Response to Covid-19” was organized during 24th and 25th Aug. 2021. All together 208 participated in the Seminar in blended mode (Online/Offline). During this seminar the students shared their research findings with their peers and it became a platform for peer learning.

7. National Level Seminar on “Social Work Response to Covid-19”

Two Days National Seminar on “Social Work Response to Covid-19” was organized during 31st Aug and 1st Sept. 2021. All together 230 students participated in the Seminar which was conducted in blended mode (Online/Offline). Shri. Popatrao Pawar from Hiware Bazaar gave the key note address. During this seminar, students and faculty members across the country shared their experience and learning of addressing various challenges of COVID-19 pandemic. There were presentations from TISS, Tuljapur, TISS, Mumbai, MSS School of Social Work, Nagpur and Department of Social work, Delhi University during this National Seminar. Papers were also presented from the states of Jharkhand and Assam.

8. Faculty sensitisation workshop on human trafficking

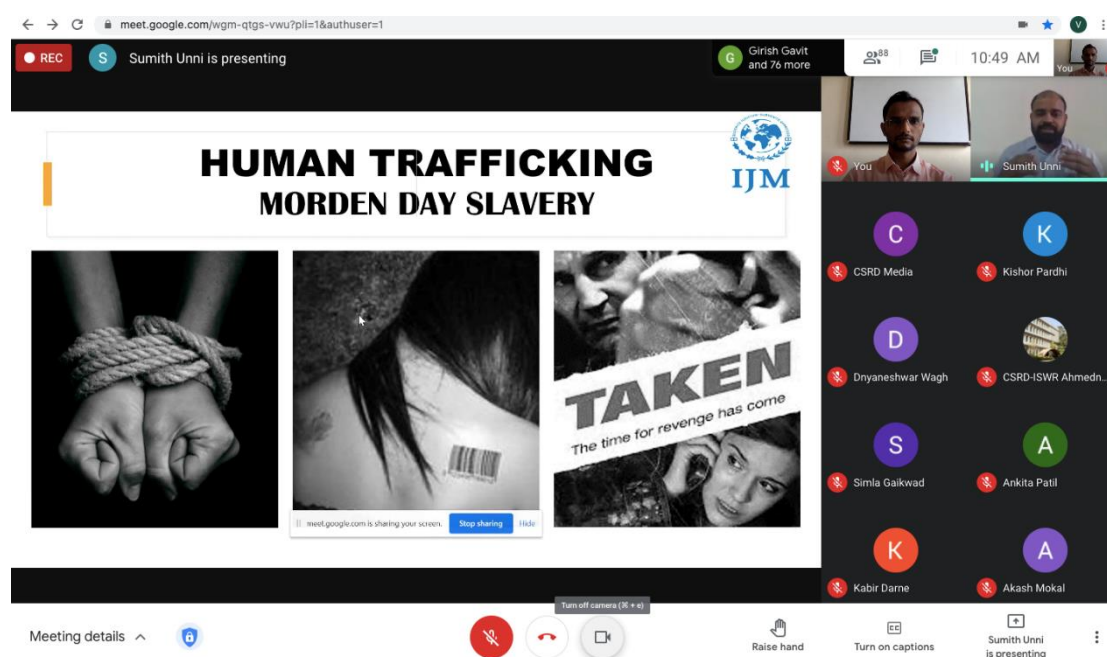
Faculty sensitisation on human trafficking conducted by resource persons (Mervin D’Mello and Sumit) from International Justice Mission was held on 22 January 2021. Fundamental aspirations are freedom and development. Ten faculty members participated in the workshop. IJM works for rescue of girls and other bonded labourers, prosecution of perpetrators, rehabilitation (trauma counselling, free legal aid, education and skill development, prepare people for employment), restoration, and sharing knowledge (sharing resources and shelter home). During the workshop, the Institute has evolved an action plan to work in collaboration with International Justice Mission for its various interventions involving the students of the Institute.

9. Workshop on Human Right Issues: perspective and challenges

On the occasion of International Human Right Day a programme was organized by the NSS unit of the Institute on 11 December 2020. The resource person for the programme was Adv. Sagar Gaikwad, Civil Court, Ahmednagar. At the beginning the NSS programme officer Dr. Suresh Mugutmal explained the purpose of celebrating this day. Still there are so many people who are not aware of their basic right. We people from diverse background like social, economic and educational where the awareness regarding the human rights differ. In this situation, there is a greater need for human right education. Adv. Gaikwad explained the fundamental rights and basic human rights. He also tried to assess the awareness level among the students. The director of the Institute also laid the emphasis on human right education. The programme was attended 115 students and faculty.

10. Workshop on Human Trafficking and modern-day slavery

The special seminar was organized on Human Trafficking Modern Day Slavery for the volunteers on 27 March 2021. The seminar was organized in coordination with



International Social Justice Mission, Mumbai. The resource person for the session was Mr. Sumit Unni. He spoke about the present condition of human trafficking in India and also shared various case studies to learn more about it and also spoke about the laws related to human trafficking. The resource person was introduced and welcomed by Mrs. Aasawari Zapake (Assistant Professor) and vote of thanks were proposed by Mr. Pradeep Jare (Assistant Professor).
